To – V(bare inf)
In order to / so as to + V (bare -inf)
In order not to / so as not to + V (inf)

Ex: He went to the baker's **to buy** some bread
We have to work harder **in order to pass** the exam.
She's learning English **so as to get** a better job.
Mary was hurrying **in order not to miss** her bus. \
He left early **so as not to be** late for the meeting.
